Return to Campus:

August 18, 2020 - Distance Learning





While the new school year will begin on August 18, 2020, L.A. Unified Superintendent Austin Beutner has announced it will not start with students at school facilities. The health and safety of all in the school community is not something we can compromise. Schools will utilize distance learning which will be online learning from home 5 days a week. We understand the challenge this creates. As a parent, however, this was a tough decision as remote learning is not a replacement for in-person learning. Since public health is our foremost priority, we are taking guidance from DPH, CDC, CDE, and the County Dept of Health. The District has been actively working on a return-to-campus plan with the hope of transitioning to a hybrid model, and eventually a full return to campus.


