School Goals

By June 2024:

- the number of K-2nd grade students performing At Benchmark or Above Benchmark will increase by 5 points, from 63% to 68%, as measured by the Basic Early Literacy Skills assessment (DIBELS)
- the percentage of 3-5th grade students demonstrating a thorough ability to consistently perform Above Standard in the area of Reading to understand complex stories and information will increase from 28.7% to 34%, as measured by ELA CAASPP.
- the percentage of EL students in 3-5 meeting the basic skills criteria on reclassification will increase by 5% from Spring of 2023 as measured by the MMED focus dashboard.
- the percentage of 3rd-5th grade students demonstrating a thorough ability to consistently perform Above Standard in the area of Concepts and Procedures will increase from 26.2% to 32%, as measured by Math CAASPP.
- the percentage of Chronic Absenteeism for All Students will decrease from 38.1% to 25% as measured by the LAUSD FOCUS Dashboard.
